Young Adults in Global Missions (YAGM)

What is yagm?

The ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program is a one-year international service learning opportunity for young adults, ages 21-29. These young adults serve alongside companion church bodies and organizations in one of thirteen countries around the world in a transformative, cross-cultural journey of service.

Current YAGM country programs include: Argentina & Uruguay, Australia, Cambodia, Central Europe, Jerusalem/West Bank, Madagascar, Mexico, Rwanda, Senegal, Southern Africa, and the United Kingdom. YAGM volunteers begin international service in August, returning to the US in late July or early August of the following year.

It costs the ELCA an average of \$15,000 to send a YAGM volunteer for a year of international service. Of that total cost, the ELCA covers nearly 70%. YAGM volunteers commit to a \$5,000 fundraising effort to contribute to the cost of service.

All Saints Lutheran Church has been sponsoring YAGM volunteers since 2012. Through their experiences related via newsletters, blogs and emails, we have learned about the rewarding programs they are participating in. We have had the privilege of having several volunteers visit All Saints and participate in our Missionary Sundays in October at which time they have shared their experiences and, most importantly, the spiritual and meaningful journey experienced in their year abroad in their host countries.
