“Let the little children come to me,” Jesus said.  
He didn’t say, “and let them be like little adults.”

Actually, he said something like “unless you are like a little child, you cannot enter the kingdom of God.” He encouraged all of us to come to worship, to learning, to living, with the wonder and energy and joy of a little child.

Children are not the future of the church. They are a vital, vibrant part of the Body of Christ right now. We are responsible to teach them and to love them. We can also learn from them – from their energy and freedom and the “spirit of joy in God’s presence” as only they can express it.

We want children and families to be comfortable worshipping with us and growing with us in Christ. There are certain things that go along with that – things that are very important to me as a pastor:

**Children are always welcome in church. In the sanctuary.** As children, not little adults.

The new Kid Space – or Playground – in the sanctuary is designed to make children and their parents feel welcome – and to keep the youngest ones happily busy in church until they can participate more fully. They might make kid noises. That’s ok.

I always welcome young children to Holy Communion. I will abide by the wishes of parents, but will offer communion and communion instruction to kids of any age. We believe Jesus is truly present in the meal – how can we deny that blessing to the youngest among us? Also, kids do not have to be very old to realize they are being left out – that we are sharing something with each other, but not them. Is that how we want them to experience church?

We don’t know what it takes for a family to get here on a Sunday morning, what their life is like, what struggles they face. Can we be a place that welcomes them, as they are, with no other expectations – where they are loved and embraced and ensured that they are enough, and beloved in the eyes of God? There are churches I’ve never returned to when people glared at me about my kids.

**Children are always welcome in worship.** We have options for nursery and Bible breakout for families that wish, but they are not mandatory.

May we all be welcome in the Body of Christ in the fullness of who we are, and may grow together in faithfulness and love for one another.

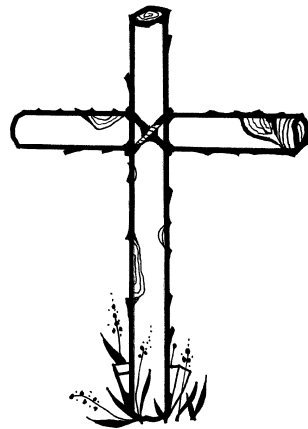

On **Tuesday, February 13**, the ASLC Youth Group will be hosting its annual Pancake Dinner.

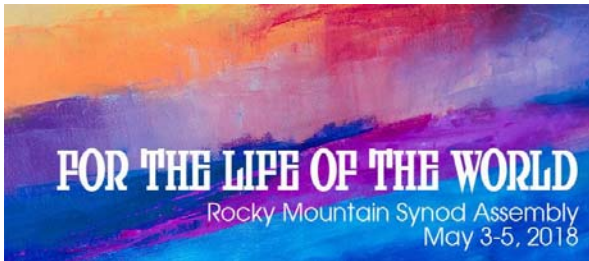

# REFORMATION 500

As we commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, *Living Lutheran* is exploring 500 of its unique aspects, with 50 Reformation things you may not know about the Reformation.

This list is not meant as an all-encompassing compendium of everything essential to the Reformation and its theology, but rather as a glimpse of the variety of ways the movement that Luther sparked in 1517 would influence the history of the world. Here are the last 10:

41. Today, more than 200 denominations and churches in North America have histories connected to the Reformation.

42. Worldwide, the number of Christians has more than tripled in the last 100 years. But the world's overall population also has risen rapidly, so Christians make up about the same portion of the world's population today (32 percent) as they did a century ago (35 percent).

43. An abundance of festivals, exhibits, concerts and tours are taking place across Germany throughout 2017 in recognition of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.

44. Christian education was a passion of Luther's. He encouraged a partnership between the home and the church in which parents would take the lead and the church would assist.

45. The reformers taught God's dominion over the world, creation and all things and helped revive an interest in the world that was increasingly receptive to an encouraging of exploration, study and rediscovery of nature and the universe—without losing sight of faith and spirituality.

46. Stirring changes and new thinking about the church, religion, politics, law, economics, education and society, the Reformation influenced the transition from the Middle Ages to the modern period and Age of Discovery.

47. Luther didn't lay a personal, unique claim to his beliefs and teachings. He declared in a sermon, "It is not my doctrine, not my creation, but God's gift ... . Dear Lord God, it was not spun out of my head, nor grown in my garden. Nor did it flow out of my spring, nor was it born of me. It is God's gift, not a human discovery."

48. Researchers and archaeologists have recently corroborated the assertion that Luther was a well-educated thinker and prolific writer, producing an average of 1,800 pages a year.

49. Recently discovered archive documents have revealed that an arranged marriage of Luther by his father may have been imminent for the young man and most likely played a major role in his leaving his study of law and joining the order of the Augustinian Hermits at the monastery in Erfurt.

50. During and after the Reformation, there was a sharp decline in the commissioning of large-scale works of biblical art by Protestant churches.



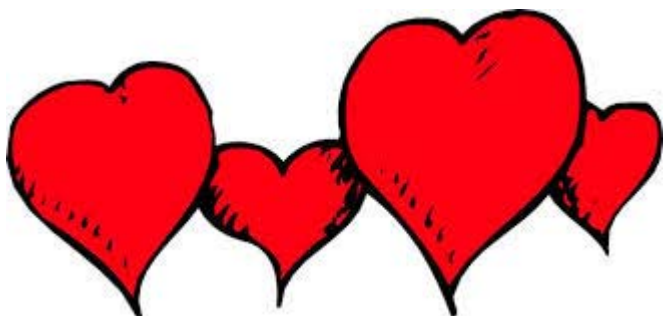


