During her time away, Pastor Kristin will spend time traveling with her family in the United Kingdom, completing a mentorship in fused glass with a local artist, and engage in a silent retreat at Benet Hill Monastery in Colorado. We pray this time for her time is one of rest and fulfillment.

There are several opportunities planned for congregation renewal while Pastor Kristin is away and it is our hope that everyone will participate! The full calendar is below and prior to each activity, more detailed information will be available in the newsletter, but we want you to mark your calendar now so you don't miss out. - June 2 Worship with Entourage Jazz- Worship "officially" begins our sabbatical and renewal time as we send blessings with Pastor Kristin on her journey and welcome pastoral leadership during this time.
- **June 14&15-** Deacon Tammy Devine will lead a 1-1/2 day retreat "Living Our Baptismal Promise." The retreat is a spiritual journey where we rediscover our own strengths and values and how we use them to live our baptismal promise.
- June 16- Deacon Tammy Devine will lead an all congregation discussion following worship about the Congregation Autobiography where we have been and where we are going.
- July 13- The Rev. Dr. Mark Allan Powell will lead a workshop on "How Lutheran's Interpret the Bible." Other congregations will be invited, included those of differing denominations, to explore the ways Lutherans think about scripture and it's meaning for life today.
- **July 14-** The Rev Dr. Mark Alen Powell will preach at morning worship.
- **September 1-**Congregation glass art project following worship. Working with a local artist, the congregation will help create a large mosaic that represents the spirit of All Saints that when complete will be mounted on the building.
- **September 8-**Congregational Lunch -A catered lunch will be provided to enjoy fellowship time and the opportunity to hear from Pastor Kristin about her sabbatical and from lay leaders about the renewal activities of the congregation.

JULY RENEWAL ACTIVITY!

Interpreting the Bible with Grace

Join us for a half-day conversation about the Bible with Rev. Dr. Mark Allen Powell! We'll talk about where the Bible comes from, how to interpret it in context, and how we are to understand the Bible for our own times. The session reflects on seven questions about Lutherans and the Bible. He does not prescribe "the Lutheran way" to read the Bible nor does he dismiss the way you may have come to understand the Bible. Instead Dr. Powell presents a variety of Lutheran perspectives for interpreting the Bible.

Dr. Powell was Professor of New Testament at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio until his retirement in 2018. He is editor of the HarperCollins Bible Dictionary and author of more than 100 articles and 35 books on the Bible and religion. He has also worked as a professional music critic, with more than 1000 published reviews in the fields of rock and pop music. The two fields of music criticism and religious scholarship come together in Encyclopedia of Contemporary Christian Music, his critical survey and analysis of artists in both the religious and mainstream markets who have produced faith-oriented products.

Dr. Powell will also be preaching on Sunday, July 14.

ADVOCACY: GLOBAL REFUGE (formerly Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Service) – Part 4 Partnering with People So That They Can Live Sustainably in their Own Countries:

Many people are in motion worldwide who may not fit neatly into treaty or policy definitions of 'refugee' or 'asylum seeker,' yet their situations are dire. They cannot feed or shelter their families adequately. Colonialism, climate change, and civil unrest all can drive economic migration. Global Refuge and other organizations have programs we can support so that people who are not otherwise in danger can stay in their home countries.

In Mexico and Central America

The Global Refuge: Camino a Casa: Many young Guatemalans migrate to earn money to help their families back home. If turned away at the U.S. border, they are repatriated to Guatemala, where they face debt and have little access to education, jobs, or treatment for migration-related trauma. Now, thanks to Camino a Casa, a new Global Refuge initiative in Guatemala, repatriated youth have support. They can get education and vocational training, learn financial literacy, and be referred for legal, medical, and mental health services. Camino a Casa Program | Global Refuge

Centro Santa Catalina in Cd. Juarez: Just miles from the U.S.-Mexico border is a sewing co-op operated by women of vibrant faith. They live and work on the old landfill of Cd. Juarez, where they struggle to afford life's essentials and their children's public school fees. Through cross-border partnerships, much good is happening. The women take part in adult education. Their children receive music lessons, tutoring, and computers. Some are going on to college in Mexico and entering professions in their home country. Worldwide

The ELCA's World Hunger: All Saints has long supported the ELCA's World Hunger program. <u>ELCA World Hunger - Evangelical Lutheran Church in America</u> At work in 60 countries, the ELCA responds to the fact that 821 million people globally are hungry. Ten percent (10%) of the world's people live in extreme poverty—on less than \$1.90 a day. We partner with in-country churches and others to move beyond direct relief to development. The goal is sustainable agricultural systems, clean water sources, good education, and access to health care. World Hunger also responds to needs in the U.S. and helps support Lutheran Advocacy Ministry-NM.

Bread for the World: Nourish Our Future. Bread's new campaign addresses child hunger through advocacy. The goal is to prevent malnutrition-related child deaths in countries most burdened by hunger and to improve the lives of mothers and children experiencing food insecurity in the U.S. Until more details of the campaign are available, please see the Bread site on the five hungriest places at this time: Gaza and four African areas.
