Welcome to All Saints Lutheran Church

We are glad you are here! Our gathering is made more complete by your presence, and we hope that you are gifted by Christ among us, as well. If you need help with anything, please don't hesitate to ask as usher or someone who looks like they know what they are doing.

Who Can Come to the Meal?

You are welcome to receive Holy Communion with us at the table, whether you are a guest or a member, believer or doubter. God offers this meal to you and all creation so that you will know you are loved and invited into the community of God's people. We believe that this meals transforms us together into the body of Christ for the sake of the world. All ages are welcome. You may receive a blessing instead of eating and drinking – please simply cross your arms over your chest when you come forward for such a blessing.

How Do I Participate in the Meal?

The usher will direct your row to come forward down the center aisle. If you cannot come forward, please let an usher know, and we will come to you. The pastor will give you a piece of gluten free bread, then the assisting minister will serve you wine (red) or grape juice (white) in an individual cup. After you drink, place the cup in the basket as you return to your seat.

Children

Children are always welcome in worship at All Saints! There is a part of the sanctuary set aside for the comfort and activity level of young children, and you can also pick up an activity bag there to take to your seat elsewhere in the sanctuary

Rest Rooms

Men's and Women's rest rooms are located in the hall south of the sanctuary (to your right as you sit in the church). Family/non-gender rest rooms are located down the west hall behind the kitchen.

Assistive Listening

If you require assistive listening device, please see the ushers or pick one up from the sound board at the south of the sanctuary.
